Thank you for your information request indicated in bold below, which has now been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 by NHS Cheshire & Merseyside Integrated Care Board (ICB). I am able to provide you with the following information and responses.

Please note from 01 July 2022, Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) were disestablished, and their statutory functions and responsibilities inherited by NHS Cheshire and Merseyside ICB.

Your Request:

1) How much of the ICB (Previously CCG) Budget is attributed to engaging innovative technology to support with delivery of healthcare?

2) How many tenders did the ICB (previously the CCG) issue in the last 24 months for the purposes of engaging Software as a Service? What was the total value of all the contracts awarded?

3) How many (or what percentage) of the above tenders required ISO27001 as an essential or desirable accreditation for bidders?

4) How many (or what percentage) of the above tenders required Cyber Essentials or Cyber Essentials Plus as an essential or desired accreditation for bidders?
