Thank you for your information request indicated in bold below, which has now been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 by NHS Cheshire & Merseyside Integrated Care Board (ICB). I am able to provide you with the following information and responses.

Please note from 01 July 2022, Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) were disestablished, and their statutory functions and responsibilities inherited by NHS Cheshire and Merseyside ICB.

**Your Request:**

**1) Per calendar year between 2018 and 2022, how many people were detained under the Mental Health Act? Alongside the total, please provide a breakdown by immigration status and age.**

**2) Per month, between January 2022 to April 2023, how many people were detained under the Mental Health Act? Alongside the total, please provide a breakdown by immigration status and age.**

**Our Response:**

1 – 2) NHS Cheshire & Merseyside ICB does not hold data detailing people detained under the Mental Health Act by the categories requested (immigration status/age) to enable us to report on this specific data between 2018 to April 2023.
